To All Pet Owners

Please clean up after your pets and be respectful of other's property. Please do not allow your pets to urinate/defecate on trees, planters, lamp posts, etc. All dogs and cats must be on a leash when leaving your premises. Several complaints have been received regarding dogs and cats running at large. **Please ensure your animals are kept within your property limits at all times.**

Emergency Preparedness

Take the following steps so you and your family are prepared in the event of an emergency:

- Have a safe room in your home where everyone gathers during a storm — away from windows, skylights and glass doors
- If there's a tornado, gather in a basement, storm cellar or interior room on the lowest floor
- Remove dead or rotting trees and branches that could fall and cause injury or damage
- Bring inside or tie-down garbage cans and lawn furniture
- Use surge protectors — a safety electrical plug that will shut off the power if lightning strikes to prevent damage to your computer and other household item
