### Dog Tags

Anyone owning or caring for a dog(s) for an extended period within our municipality must obtain a dog tag on an annual basis, for each dog. They are available at the Emo Municipal Office for a fee of \$10.00 each.

Reminder: Pets are NOT permitted in our Parks – this includes the Lion's Park, Westend Park/West Boat Launch and Emo Sportsfield. If walking through, please remain on the sidewalk.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

The Emo Emergency Control Group want to remind all residents of the community that during the summer months, severe weather can result in an emergency or disaster situation at any time. To ensure our safety and survival, everyone should create an emergency preparedness plan for your family and home. Weather events such as tornados, lightning and heavy rainfall can strike with little or no warning that could result in injury, property loss, loss of hydro and phone services and localized flooding. ### Emergency Survival Kit

- Flashlight and spare batteries
- Radio or crank radio (so you can listen to news bulletins)
- First-aid kit
- Candles, matches/lighter
- Extra car keys and cash (including coins/cards for telephone)
- Important papers (identification for everyone, personal documents such as insurance papers)
- Food and bottled water
- Clothing and footwear (one change of clothes per person)
- Blankets or sleeping bags (one blanket or sleeping bag per person)
- Toilet paper and other personal supplies such as shampoo, hairbrush, tooth brush and toothpaste, soap and a towel and face cloth (one for each person)
- Medication
- Backpack/duffel bag (or something else to carry the emergency survival kit in, in case you have to evacuate)
- Whistle (in case you need to attract someone's attention)
- Playing cards, gum
